Technical Equipment

For the latter, the ability to participate in videoconferences and having a stable internet connection are highly recommended. While you are welcome to use the eduroam WiFi at university (please check here for information how to get access and set this up: <https://www.uni-bremen.de/en/zfn/wifi/instructions-wifi>), please be mindful that there are no extra rooms for attending digital lectures at the university beyond the common spaces (e.g., in the MZH building on campus). For the former, some lectures are relying on virtual whiteboards, live quizzes, and other forms of e-enabled learning. Please check with the lecturers before your courses start to see what equipment might be needed or talk to your fellow students.
