te Treptow studied Law and Political Science at the University of Bremen. After passing her state exam, she worked for the Deutsche Gewerkschaftsbund (DGB (Federation of German Trade Unions)). After Germany's reunification, she played a crucial role in establishing DGB legal protection in the new states. She has been a Member of the Bremen Parliament, Director of European Affairs at the University of Oldenburg and has worked as an attorney in the field of corporate consulting and in the insurance sector. She has now turned her hobby into a profession and is self-employed as a travel companion for exclusive readers' tours. 1. When did you study/work at the University of Bremen and why did you choose Bremen?

I studied in Bremen from 1981 to

"It was the

I studied in Bremen from 1981 to 1990. Before that, I worked as Deputy Director of the Bafög (federal financial aid) Department at the university. As a Bremen native, I only considered Bremen as it offered single-phase legal education.

2. What was your most important experience at the University of Bremen?

It was the greatest time of my life. There were

intense discussions between students and professors. But we didn't just have discussions, we also learned a lot, but not by memorization. I am still grateful for the fact that I really learned how to work scientifically. We studied in small groups and there was enough time to be active in the student administration. So I was in both AstA and, later on, the training staff council. There were only 110 law students per year, so we knew each other and were in close contact. I still enjoy the friendships I made at the time.

3. Who or what has influenced your career the most?

Of course my previous professional qualifications played a role, but the funding from the Hans-Böckler Foundation played an even greater role. Having worked in an interdisciplinary foundation work group on genetic engineering, I was able to implement those skills in my pro-

ject-based course of studies at the university. My three se-

mesters at the University of Zurich were also something special back then.

4. What would you like to pass on to students at the University of

Bremen?

Today's course of studies is no longer comparable to what I experienced at the University of Bremen. Still, I can only recommend that

every student go abroad. Studying for a few semesters abroad or the travel and work program are experiences that ultimately make you a more liberal-minded and tolerant person. And students shouldn't be afraid to look for mentors among alumni and at foundations.

Awards for Concepts in Foreign Language Didactics

Two new teaching concepts in English foreign language didactics at the University of Bremen have recently been awarded prizes. The "Forschendes Lernen in der Englischdidaktik (ForschEND (Research-based learning in English Didactics))" project will now receive funding of €15,000. The focal points of this project include the anchoring of practical references in the Bachelor curriculum and the integration of heterogeneous educational requirements for

students.

For the second project, during the 2014/2015 winter semester, students on the Master of Education program researched the connection between theory and practice in teaching courses of study. The concept was awarded €10,000.

Both concepts were developed under the leadership of English Studies professors Sabine Doff and Dr. Regine Komoss, Managing Director of the Center for Teacher Training.

Dr.-Ing. Cord Winkelmann from the Electrical Engineering Department at the University of Bremen has been awarded the "Innovation Award" from the Schaeffler FAG Foundation for his doctoral thesis. The microsystems engineer received first prize, which includes €10,000 from the foundation, for his dissertation on sensory surfaces. Dr. Winkelmann has developed a method for equipping roller bearings with sensors on a

running surface. The objective of this process is to measure the forces in effect. In the laudatory speech, this method was praised as "absolutely pioneering work". Cord Winkelmann has since taken the idea of sensory surface monitoring of machines and system components and started his own company, a university spin-off company, called "Winkelmann Mikrosysteme".

Excellent Research: The University of Bremen Receives Four Awards from the European Research Council

our professors from the University of Bremen were recently awarded the ERC Consolidator Grant, one of the most distinguished and highly coveted grants for researchers in all of Europe.

Prof. Dr. Rita Groß-Hardt (Biology), Dr. Rebbeka von Mallinckrodt (History), Prof. Dr. Andreas Fischer-Lescano (Law) and Prof. Dr. Carsten Lutz (Computer Sciences) will each receive approximately €2 million in funding

for their projects from the European Research Council (ERC) over the next five years. "These awards show that we are among the top competitive research universities in Europe," says Professor Kurosch Rezwan, Deputy Dean of the University of Bremen. "I am particularly happy that our colleagues from a wide range of disciplines have come out on top against strong international competition."





"Networking from, for and with alumni": Upcoming Events

The "Networking from, for and with alumni" series has made quite an impression; the last two events were a complete success. In response to this, yet more great events have been planned for the upcoming months.

The events continue on May 9, 2015 with a Career consultation workshop at the University of Bremen. The offer is primarily aimed at alumni who already have some professional experience, but young professionals are also very welcome. At the interactive workshop (10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.), three central topics will be discussed with an experienced coach and a so-called "recruiter" (formerly headhunter) from "c-level42": "What is the right professional fit for me?", "How do I build my own brand?" and

"How do I find a new job?" In addition to these topics, which will be discussed in the forum and in work groups, there will be time for individual questions and networking.

Since the number of participants is limited to 30, we request that you book by email or on the telephone. A fee of €10 will be charged (catering included). If possible, we ask participants to bring their laptop/tablet.

On June 11, 2015, at the invitation of MP Carsten Sieling, the alumni association will visit the German Bundestag. At 12:00, the participants will be expected at the Bremen State Representatives' Office in Berlin. After a presentation on the topic of "Political work, Bremen in Berlin and Brussels", lunch will be provided. Then the participants will continue to the Bun-

destag. There, the alumni will have the opportunity of attending a Bundestag plenary session. Later, at 4.00 p.m., Mr. Sieling will be available to discuss the topic of "State fiscal equalization/reorganization of federal-state matters".

Since the number of participants is limited to 17, we request that you book by email or on the telephone. The trip is being funded by the German Bundestag so we are able to travel to Berlin as a group for a fee of €20 per person.

Xenos e.V.: assistance for foreign students in need

Xenos e.V. is an association of Bremen universities which provides assistance to foreign students in need. It was founded with the objective of providing financial or material help by, for instance, covering the costs of rent or health insurance on a short-term basis. For more than 30 years, the association has provided help quickly and without bureaucracy. It aims to help students who may otherwise struggle with or have to discontinue their studies through circumstances beyond their control. These circumstances might include civil war and political upheaval in their native countries, but also missed scholarship payments, illnesses or accidents.

There has been a new board of directors since 2014, and Deputy Director, Prof. Dr. Yasemin Karakaşoğlu, is the chairman of the association. Along with the association's sponsor, former Rector Prof. Dr. Wilfried Müller, she is working to increase awareness of the association and recruit new supporters. This workshop recently took place in Kribi on Cameroon's Atlantic coast. The topic of "Interculturalism and Language," as relates to the 200 different languages spoken in Cameroon, led to lively discussions. Other aspects which played a role included religious studies, geography and urban planning, different teaching methods and content or colonial history, the traces of which are particularly apparent in a German cemetery in Kribi and which were viewed with interest by the German participants.

After two days of intense discussion, a number of new ideas for collaboration were on the agenda, spanning from joint research projects through to student exchanges and which will enrich cooperation between the universities.
